As of this morning we have researched the files of 2012 through 2018, year-to-date, and individually prepared about 85-hundred pages not including almost 1-thousand pages previous pulled for Sunshine requests.

It was a time-consuming task, having spent six full work days just on this, as each requisition had to be researched, all the staples removed (some with as many as five staples per requisition) by hand, then each page, paper and receipt was hand scanned electronically. As you can imagine, with multiple persons handling the files over six years, we felt like Sheriff Bullock investigating a mystery.

The four members of the County Auditor's department staff have spent 161-hours just for the preparation of this audit by the state. That does not include the hours for Sunshine requests.

These numbers also do not include the time and paper work from the other county offices for the audit.

The state auditors spent two days in our office as well as spending time with other office-holders and are reviewing our work, and were complimentary to our due diligence. At present, they are expected to return next week to this building.
